## Weekly update on our Activities

Two Animal Birth Control camps have been organised this week where numerous sterilisation on dogs was conducted by the Kalimpong Animal Shelter Team.

With this frequent weather change, a lot of dogs is infected with Canine Distemper. So every day such cases visit the Animal Clinic. Diseases and flu like fever, diarhhoea, vomiting, indigestion in dogs are some of the common sickness the Vet, Dr. Deo Pandey and team are treating currently at KAS, not forgetting many sterilization and emergency cases.



Starting Monday, a Village Spay and Neuter Camp was held in 6<sup>th</sup> Mile, Kalimpong where fifteen community and owned pet animals were spayed. The team too raised a little donation from this camp.

At the Animal Clinic, Mr. Sanjeev and a few of the team members were present to attend to clinical and follow-up cases.

Lots of dogs with skin issues have visited Dr. Deo on Tuesday at the KAS clinic. Dogs coming for the follow ups are basically those who have been kept on saline drips and antibiotic course. The Vet monitors and the team of Paravets help in providing treatment to these sick animals.







The Animal Birth Control Prg. was scheduled for Wednesday and Thursday where many owners brought their pet animals, cats and dogs for their sterilisation. There were more than fifteen dogs that were spayed by Dr. Deo assisted by Mr. Lil and Mahesh. Whereas, the preparation of these cats and dogs pre sterilisation was done by Mr. Lakpa and Padam. Dogs after sterilisation are always made to rest as they are unconscious and are checked and monitored well by the Vet and team. We too ensure that their vaccination against rabies is done.

A mega Animal Birth Control camp was held on Friday by the Veterinary Alumni Association at 11<sup>th</sup> Mile, Govt. Veterinary Hospital in Kalimpong. Dr. Deo, Mr. Lakpa, Mahesh and Padam attended this camp where they prepared 28 dogs for sterilisation. All dogs were vaccinated against rabies and were asked to give post-operative care at Home by Dr. Deo along with some prescribed medicines and ointment by him.







New clinical cases were seen on Saturday by Dr. Deo and a fewer blood tests on dogs were conducted for their diagnosis.
