## The monthly report from Darjeeling Animal Shelter

The sister Shelter – Darjeeling Animal Shelter has conducted fourty five ABCs on dogs in the month of June and with over twenty-four rescues of street and community dogs including puppies. Four puppies that were rescued have already been adopted and the other seven are waiting to find a loving home.

The no. of OPD cases seen in the month of June was three hundred and eleven. Cases of dogs stricken with Parvovirus are on the rise so numerous cases follow up every day thus, keeping the team busy.



DAS has ushered in a few visitors this month -


From Dr Rosalie Chapple and Nynke Kooistra from Australia to the Pedigree team from Mumbai who helped both Shelters with free food a few months ago.


